We have had a busy, productive start to 2016!

I would like to congratulate Y12 and Y 2 on their attendance this half term. Year 12 have an attendance of 99.07% and Y2 96.54%. As a school we aim for 96%.

Attendance Percentage	Days missed over a school year
100%	0 days
95%	10 days
90%	20 days
85%	30 days
80%	40 days

We believe that:

Regular attendance promotes the effective and continuous learning of all students

Regular attendance promotes positive friendships and well-being

Legally children have to attend school for a minimum of 80%.

Good habits of attendance and punctuality will assist to develop self-discipline and responsibility in preparation for future employment

If students achieve 100% attendance, they still have 186 days of holiday.

REMEMBER - Only 35% of students who miss 10-20% of school will achieve 5A*-C grades at GCSE (including English and Maths).
