

The Iberian lynx has spotted fur and weighs about half as much as the Eurasian species, with long legs and a very short tail with a black tip. Its coat is tanned with dark spots and it has a characteristic "beard" around its face and important black ear tufts.

Weight: 10-13 kg

• Height: 88-100cm

The Iberian lynx mostly depends on wild rabbits to feed, but it will also eat ducks, young deer and partridges if rabbit densities are low. While an adult lynx needs about one rabbit a day, a mother raising her young needs to catch about three.

### WHAT WE'VE BEEN LEARNING THIS TERM




We're going to show you what we've been learning this term in some subjects. We are going to talk about the interesting and amazing things that we've been doing in Maths, English, Science and Art.

Our conclusion is that a lot of people chose the same subjects but everyone likes P.E more because you are outside for the lesson, you can play with your friends and also for people who like sports.




#### Book Review 'THE CURIOUS INCIDENT OF THE DOG IN THE NIGHTTIME'

#### The Great Garbage Patch

Unfortunately humans have created islands of trash floating in the ocean and these are killing lots of sea animals, and destroying all the habitats in the ocean. Nearly 100,000 animals have died because of the garbage patch. Scientists are trying to recollect all the rubbish, but they don't know how to recollect an island the size of France!

Before talking about deeper details, we need to know the origin of the trash island. This garbage patch is made of plastic, but how did plastic get into the ocean? Well, it's very simple: through rivers, from boats (things that fall out, oils, etc), down the drain and of course, from factories.

The problems are: marine animals die, turtles and other animals eat the plastic and die; the island gets bigger and bigger each time, this makes it more difficult to recollect; it's nearly impossible to stop it as it's as big as France (1.6 million square kilometers), although we think this only affects the sea, it doesn't! Fish eat plastic and other things that we throw to the sea, but then, we eat this fish, so it's like eating our own trash!

What can we do to help stop the great garbage patch? We can do loads of things, for example, we could try to use less single-use plastic, keep and reuse the plastic bags from the supermarket, or just buy a cloth bag, and make use of that for the shopping. We can use a refillable water bottle instead of a normal plastic bottle, we should stop using single-use plastic, an alternative is reusable objects, or objects made with other materials, for example, metal water bottles, cloth bags, etc. Keeping plastic away from water helps the environment greatly!

# Go ogle's history

Google is a multi-millionaire company that is known worldwide for the search engine Google and the video streaming app YouTube, but did you know how it was founded?

In 1998, three students from Stanford, California, called Larry Page, Sergey Brin and Scott Hassan wanted to compete with the search engine that their university was using. They first named it BackRub, before changing the name to Google. Then they created the company and started on September 4th of 1998.

Their first employee was Susan Wojcicki, who is now the CEO of YouTube. They competed with big search engines, like Yahoo!, Opera, Netscape and Microsoft's Internet Explorer. In 2005, the company created an app called YouTube, in which people could upload their own videos and share it to the world and they put Susan Wojcicki as the leader. The first video in the platform was called 'Me at the zoo', a 18 second video uploaded by a user by the name 'jawed', on April 23rd 2005 and has 165 million views by 2021. The most viewed video is from a channel called PinkFong: they uploaded the viral video 'Baby Shark'. By now, it has 7.8 billion views.

This app has now been used by nearly 800 million people worldwide and has 26.1 billion videos uploaded on the platform and because of this Google is well known, but mostly because of Youtube. \*




#### **FUN FACTS**




